

3.	Discuss the apparent tension between Paul's emphasis on salvation by grace through faith (Ephesians 2:8-9) and James' emphasis on justification by works (James 2:21, 25, 24). How do you reconcile these seemingly different perspectives? How does Paul define "works" in the context of salvation, and how does James define "faith"?
4.	James talks about having a faith that works itself out in actions (James 2:14-17). How do you understand the relationship between faith and works in your daily life? What does it mean for our theology to be practical and lived out in our actions?
5.	Reflect on the statement: "Paul and James do not stand face to face, fighting against each other, but they stand back to back, fighting opposite foes." How does this imagery help in understanding their perspectives?
6.	How does the life of Jesus exemplify a theology that is enfleshed and actively involved in meeting the needs of others? In what ways do you see the teachings of Jesus being applied practically in your own life and in the life of your church community?
7.	Explore the different interpretations of "love your neighbor" and discuss how understanding our similarity to others impacts our ability to love them.
8.	How does recognizing our own sinfulness and unworthiness contribute to a spirit of thanksgiving?
9.	Discuss the idea that compassion on our enemies begins with thanksgiving. How can gratitude for God's grace enable us to forgive and have compassion on those who may hurt us?
