3. Noah was building an ark, which was both a symbol of God's judgment, but also His redemption. How are those two themes related in the opening chapters of the book of Genesis? How do you balance them in your own life?

4. Were you raised up with the belief that man is basically good on the inside or inherently bad? Have your beliefs changed? Why or why not? What observations can you make that support your belief?

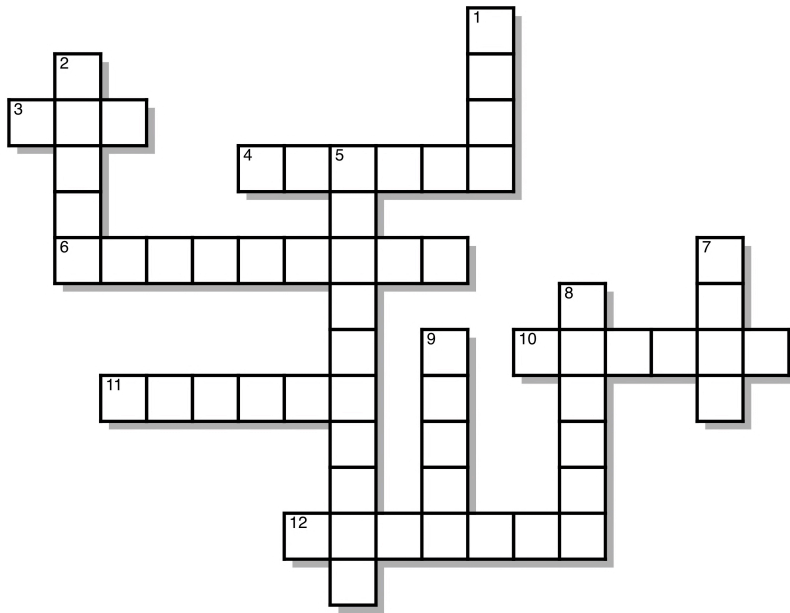
5. Think about the phrase "follow your heart". What does that mean? Why is this a shallow (and even dangerous) way of living life? What is the alternative? Why is it better?

6. How does the Lamech of Cain's line differ from the Lamech of Seth's line? How is the former a picture of the evil of his time? How does the latter differ? How does God mark the second with His seal of approval?

7. How was Noah's name (which sounds like the Hebrew word for comfort) a picture of his ministry and what God would do through him and his line?

8. How does the world define faith? How do you define it? Read Hebrews 11:1-16. How does it define faith? What do the illustrations given in this text demonstrate about the nature of faith?

9. How does your belief in God differ from Satan's? What more does God require than just agreement with right doctrine? How is this demonstrated by Noah and many other heroes of faith mentioned in Hebrews 11?
