
"THE YOKE OF RABBI JESUS"

- 8. What would Jesus' disciples have thought of the route to Galilee that Jesus chose? What would they have thought of Jesus' command for them to go and buy food from them? What was Jesus trying to teach them in doing so?

9. Why did the Samaritan woman come to this particular well? Why at this time?

10.What are some examples you can think of where sin promised fulfilment, but left you or someone else isolated and spiritually thirsty? How does yoking yourself with Jesus quench that thirst?
