3. Charles Spurgeon's plaque in his bedroom had Isaiah 48:10, "I have chosen thee in the furnace of affliction." What do you think this verse means, and how can it apply to your own life?

---
4. According to Romans 5:3-5, how does suffering contribute to our spiritual growth and character development?

---
5. Psalm 84 expresses a longing for the house of the Lord. Discuss the significance of the Psalmist's desire for God's presence in the temple. How can you relate to this longing in your own worship?

---
6. James 4:8 emphasizes drawing near to God. Share a personal experience when drawing near to God had a profound impact on your spiritual life.

---
7. Reflect on the idea that theology should begin and end with seeking God's presence, as mentioned by Dr. Dennis Kinlaw. How does your prayer life reflect your true beliefs about God?

---
8. Discuss the challenge posed by Dr. Kinlaw: "The most important thing Christians ever do is pray." How central is prayer in your life, and how does it impact your relationship with God?

9. Examine Psalm 84:11, emphasizing the importance of a blameless walk. How does holiness contribute to a closer relationship with God? What does James 4:8 tell us to cleanse? Why?

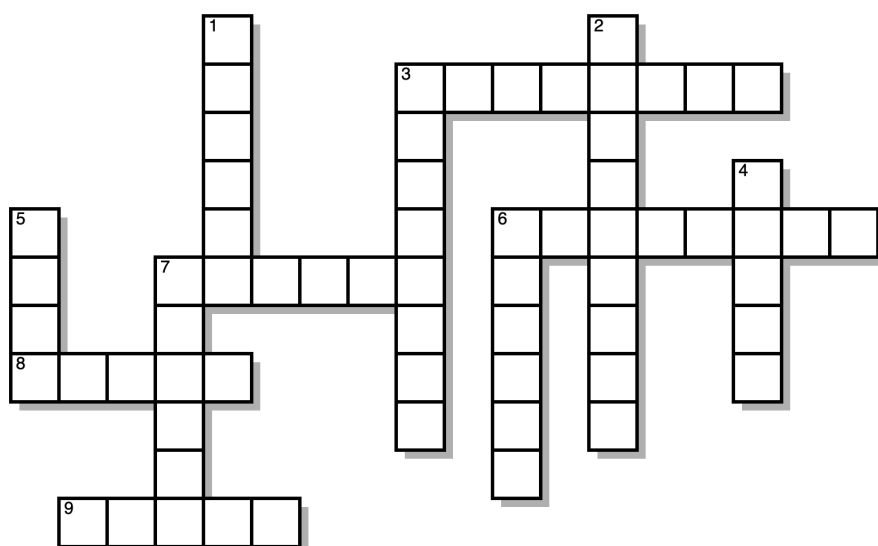
